# Introduction, v1

- Praver
  - Earthly example of his post-ascension intercession role.<sup>1</sup>
  - Typical Jewish way of praying.<sup>2</sup>
  - No prayer for deliverance but for the right perspective and necessary strength.<sup>3</sup>
  - 'the time has come' is the last of many references to Jesus' 'hour/time'.4
- Glory to the Son because...5
  - 1. Brings glory and honour to sender, Jn 5.23; 7.18
  - 2. Does the sender's will, Jn 4.34; 5.30, 38; 6.38, and works, Jn 5.36; 9.4
  - 3. Speaks the sender's words, Jn 3.34; 7.16; 12.49; 14.10, 24
  - 4. Accountable to the sender, Ch 17
  - 5. Bears witness to the sender, Jn 5.36; 7.28; see Jn 8.26
  - 6. Represents the sender accurately, Jn 12.44-45; 13.20; 15.18-25
  - 7. Exercises delegated authority, Jn 5.21-22, 27; 13.3; 17.2, 20.23
  - 8. Knows the sender intimately, Jn 7.29, see Jn 15.21; 17.8, 25
  - 9. Lives in a close relationship with the sender, Jn 8.16, 18, 29; 16.32
  - 10. Follows the sender's example, Jn 13.16

# 1. God's Gift, v2

### A. Authority

- Seen on the cross where he is proclaimed King, Jn 19.19.
- Jesus has authority:
  - to judge, Jn 5.27
  - to lay down his life and take it up again, Jn 10.18
  - over all things, Matt 28.18
- All authority a new ruler; see: Is 9.6-7; Dan 7.13-14.

#### B. Eternal Life

• Jn 3.15, 16, 36; 4.14, 36; 5.24, 39; 6.27, 40, 47, 54, 68; 10.28; 12.25, 50; 17.2, 3.

#### C. Given<sup>6</sup>

- Christ gives life: Jn 1.4; 3.15-16; 4.14; 5:21, 26; 6:33, 54; 10:10; 11:25; 14:6.
- Reminds us of Jesus' willing to his subordination to the Father, Jn 14.28.
- This humility continues in eternity, 1 Cor 15.28; 1 Cor 11.3.

# 2. God's Dream, v3

### A. Only Jesus<sup>7</sup>

• The only one who knows the Father is Jesus: Matt 11:27.

#### B. Knowing God<sup>8</sup>

- Not understanding, but relationship, Jer 31.34.9
- What does it mean to you to "know" God?

#### C. Eternal Life

- Possible in the here and now because God is life itself and Jesus is the Son of God.<sup>10</sup>
- · Are you enjoying "eternal life" already? What does that mean in daily life?

### A. Costly<sup>12</sup>

- · What did the work cost Jesus?
- · What does the work of the Gospel cost you?
- · How do you feel about the cost?

• What work/s do you think God has in mind for you to "complete" in 2016? Eph 2.10

#### C. Focussed<sup>13</sup>

What might help you to be more focussed on God and His work for you in 2016?
