Watford

Many new things have come my way this year. First and foremost the establishment of the Watford church of Christ.¹

A long-cherished dream of many of the Watford family group has become a reality thanks to the faith of the members, the generosity of the London leadership and the grace of God. Our first service was on 3 January and our official "launch" service on 8th May. Since then we have met every Sunday in Laurance Haines School (Vicarage Road, WD18 oDD) at 10.30AM.²

God has brought several new friends to us from the local area-some coming in as a result of seeing the church sign on the pavement outside! We've been blessed to have people from other congregations visit including Atlanta, Manchester, Thames Valley, Dublin and others. Tim Dannatt was a visiting speaker two months ago, and all the men in the church are getting used to speaking more frequently than in the past. As well as Sunday worship, we meet on Wednesdays for deeper Bible teaching (men and women alternate weeks) and in "Family Groups". The Gospel of Luke has been our constant companion through the year as we seek to establish a church culture that truly reflects the teachings of Jesus and what it means to follow him as disciples.

Plans for the near future include a joint outdoor service on 14 August, 11AM, with the northwest region of the London church in Cassiobury park (go to the car park and you will find ushers and signs to the exact spot). In September we will have a family service and a "Forest" service organised by Joe Cronje.

The wider Christian community in Watford has given me and the Watford church encouragement in our new venture. Local churches of all denominations have prayed for the success of our efforts. Despite differences in doctrine and practice, it is heartening to see the desire of so many people of faith in this area excited about what God is doing. We're very grateful to them and covet their prayers.
