The Supremacy of the Son of God

Stefan is speaking on Colossians 1:18 this morning. I thought I would add a few notes on the paragraph surrounding this special verse.

"The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all

things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross." Col 1:15-20

The paragraph

vv 15-20 might have already existed as a Christian hymn. If this section predates Paul it's a very early affirmation of the deity of Christ.

Christ - The Lord of Creation & Redemption, vv15-20

Here is a beautiful picture of the loving Christ he who made it all, saved it all.

a. Creation; vv15-17

We became holy because he became flesh. This might remind us of of Gen 1.27. He is the "firstborn" as in most honoured, not as in first created. "He who tells us how to go to heaven, also knows how the heavens go."

v17, A passage strongly affirming the deity of Christ. " ...a generation after Paul's death Pliny the Younger, describing Christians of his day to the Emperor Trajan, states, "They affirmed, moreover, the sum-total of their guilt or error was this, that they were in the habit of meeting on a certain fixed day before it was light, when they sang in alternate verses a hymn to Christ as to a God..." If we have him we do not need fear life's problems - salvation is secure.

b. Redemption; vv18-20

v18, If Jesus is the head he has an organic influence on us - growth, life - and a ruling influence - authority, guidance. He is supreme in his victory over death - he was the first to be resurrected (not resuscitated) and live for ever (Lazarus died again). He is 'firstborn', as in 'superior', holding authority over death just as he has authority over creation, Col 1:15. **v19**, See John 1, Heb 1:3ff. All God's fullness is in Jesus. When you see Jesus you "get" God. Jesus became man so we could see and understand God. God did this with pleasure - it was not a burden. Therefore we are reminded that we are "good", that our physical existence is "good", that our bodies are "good" in God's sight. The church is the fullness of Christ. This is a challenge to us. The world cannot really see Jesus until the world sees Christ in us. Do people see Jesus in us?

Questions for prayer and reflection

- How does this passage change the way you think about Jesus?
- If he is head of the church, how can we make that a reality here in Watford?
