In the meantime, here are a couple of Scriptures to mull over. Firstly, from Jesus:

"A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But he said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves." (Luke 22:24-27)

Secondly, from the apostle Paul:

"We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness." (Romans 12:6-8 NRSV)

I'm looking forward to exploring this topic as a congregation. Let's pray that God brings us to the right conclusions here in Watford.

"Heart of a Child" Series

You may remember that I recently taught a three-part series based on Matthew 18. The chapter begins with this passage:

"At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked,
"Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He
called a child, whom he put among them, and said,
"Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like
children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest
in the kingdom of heaven. Whoever welcomes one such
child in my name welcomes me." Matthew 18.1-5

In other words, followers of Jesus need to *develop* a childlike heart. Part of what is happening when we become a Christian is that we "become humble" like a child, deciding to trust Jesus. Then, following that, perhaps the most fundamental struggle in the Christian life is to *continue* becoming humble like a child.

So how do we do that? Well, we must first define what it looks like to have a childlike heart. In this regard, I found something I heard Sean St Jean said to be very helpful (you may remember he preached for us last year. I can thoroughly recommend his book on <u>spiritual trauma</u> - <u>https://amzn.eu/d/gcWF5wD</u>).

Earlier this year, I heard him speak on what it meant to have a childlike heart. He listed these six characteristics of a childlike heart:

- Humility
- Awe and wonder
- Not-knowing stance
- Playfulness
- Timelessness
- Utter reliance on God
