"Freely You Have Received; Freely Give" - Matthew 10 Handout

1. What's happening?

Overview:

Jesus sends out the Twelve Apostles to extend His mission — to preach, heal, and bring the good news of the kingdom of heaven.

Structure: vv. 1–4 — Jesus calls and names the Twelve. vv. 5–15 — Instructions for the mission to Israel. vv. 16–25 — Warnings of persecution. vv. 26–33 — Encouragement to be fearless. vv. 34–42 — The cost and reward of discipleship.

Key Words & Imagery: "Sheep among wolves" — vulnerability and innocence. "The kingdom of heaven has come near" — God's rule is breaking into the present (*ēngiken* = "has drawn close"). "Take up your cross" — total surrender to Christ's mission. "Peace" — wholeness and reconciliation (carries the Hebrew idea of *shalom*). [1] "Worthy" (*axios*) — having weight or value through faithful allegiance.

2. What's the setting?

The second of the <u>five discourses</u> in Matthew's gospel (after the Sermon on the Mount).^[2] It's the "Mission Discourse", preparing the disciples to carry on Jesus' work.

Historical Context: *Jewish* expectations: The Messiah would restore Israel politically. Jesus' correction: The kingdom spreads through service, suffering, and proclamation, not violence. *Roman* rule: The "Pax Romana" (peace through control) contrasts with the peace of Christ (peace through reconciliation). *Apocalyptic* hopes: People longed for deliverance; Jesus announces it is already arriving through Him.

3. What does it mean?

What is the kingdom like? *Present*: "The kingdom has come near." *Costly*: Following Jesus brings rejection and division. *Transformative*: It brings healing, peace, and new priorities. *Participatory*: The disciples share in Jesus' authority and mission.

In light of the Old Testament: Daniel 2:44— God's kingdom will outlast all others. Isaiah 9— The Prince of Peace reigns with justice. Jesus fulfils these not by force, but by self-giving love.

Present and Future: The kingdom is both "already" (experienced now through mission and obedience) and "not yet" (awaiting full realisation when Christ returns).

4. What does this mean for us?

As Kingdom Citizens: *Mission-focused*: We are sent to share good news through word and deed. *Dependent on God*: Trust in His provision; travel light. *Courageous*: "Do not fear" — our worth is secure with the Father. *Loyal to Christ*: Allegiance to Jesus comes before all else. *Peace-bringers*: We offer *shalom* wherever we go.

For the Church's Identity and Mission: The Church is a sent community, not a passive audience. Expect both fruit and friction — blessing and opposition. Success is not safety but faithful obedience. Every act of kindness ("even a cup of cold water") reflects the kingdom's heart.

Summary: The King sends His followers as vulnerable yet empowered ambassadors to bring healing, proclaim peace, endure suffering, and display the love of Christ.

"Freely you have received; freely give." — Matthew 10.8
